**RE: Pulse Asia Research's April 2025 Nationwide Survey**  
**on the May 2025 Elections**

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Pulse Asia Research, Inc. is pleased to share some findings on the May 2025 Elections from the April 2025 *Pulso ng Bayan Pre-Electoral* national survey. We request that you assist us in informing the public by disseminating this information.

The survey fieldwork was conducted from **April 20 to 24, 2025** using face-to-face interviews. This nationwide survey is based on a sample of 2,400 representative adults 18 years old and above. It has a  $\pm 2\%$  error margin at the 95% confidence level. Subnational estimates for each of the geographic areas covered in the survey (i.e., Metro Manila, the rest of Luzon, Visayas and Mindanao) have a  $\pm 6\%$  error margin for Metro Manila,  $\pm 3\%$  for the rest of Luzon,  $\pm 4\%$  for both Visayas and Mindanao, also at 95% confidence level. The following are some of the key developments that took place in the weeks immediately prior to and during the conduct of the survey interviews:

1. Absentee voting for the May 2025 midterms elections commenced on 13 April 2025 for overseas voters and on 28 April 2025 for local voters. For in-person voting on 12 May 2025, the Commission on Elections (COMELEC) began the deployment of automated counting machines (ACMs) on 04 April 2025. Meanwhile, the deployment of ballots started on 22 April 2025, with those assigned for the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) being the first to be released. The poll body also suspended campaigning by candidates was suspended on 17-18 April 2025 in observe of Maundy Thursday and Good Friday.

Several cases of election-related violence occurred in April 2025, among which are the shooting of an Albuera, Leyte mayoralty candidate on 10 April 2025 and the fatal shooting of a Rizal, Cagayan mayoralty bet on 23 April 2025, with both incidents occurring during campaign events. Following the latter's assassination, COMELEC Chairperson George Erwin M. Garcia called on the Philippine National Police (PNP) to step up its efforts to keep the elections peaceful and orderly.

The COMELEC's Task Force Safe has filed a disqualification case against a Pasig City congressional candidate before the Clerk of the Commission. This case stems from remarks made by the latter during campaign sorties that violated COMELEC Resolution No. 1116 (Anti-Discriminatory and Fair Campaigning Guidelines for the 2025 Elections).

After her return from The Hague, Netherlands, the Vice-President endorsed two (2) more senatorial candidates for the May 2025 elections in addition to the 10 who are running under the *Partido Demokratiko Pilipino-Lakas ng Bayan* (PDP-Laban). These are Senator Imee Marcos and Las Pinas City Representative Camille Villar. The former has withdrawn from the administration's *Alyansa Para sa Bagong Pilipinas* while the latter is still part of the coalition.

During the 24 April 2025 Senate hearing on alleged Chinese espionage activities in the Philippines, National Security Council (NSC) Assistant Director General Jonathan Malaya disclosed that there are China-sponsored troll farms "hired to manipulate public opinion on social media" to influence the outcome of the May 2025 elections. While China has denied the allegations, Malacañang said a more in-depth probe into the matter needs to be done.

2. Amidst the continued movements of Chinese vessels in the West Philippine Sea (WPS), the Philippines and the United States (US) held their first-ever integrated air and missile defense exercise in the area on 27 April 2025. This was part of the *Balikatan* exercises involving both countries that was launched on 21 April 2025 and will run until 09 May 2025. Prior to this, the US deployed an aircraft carrier to the Philippine Sea where it began conducting day and night flight training beginning 23 April 2025.
3. In connection with the International Criminal Court (ICC) case against former President Rodrigo R. Duterte, ICC Prosecutor Karim Khan said the investigation into the "war on drugs" of the Duterte administration is still ongoing as they are reviewing new evidence on a rolling basis. The ICC Prosecutor has been given until 01 July 2025 to complete the disclosure of evidence to be used in the next hearing for the ex-President's case, a confirmation of charges hearing, that is scheduled on 23 September 2025.

Several overseas Filipino workers (OFWs), who were arrested in Qatar on 27 March 2025 during a protect action seeking the immediate return of former President Duterte to the Philippines, have been released following the dropping of the charges of illegal assembly filed against them. Meanwhile, relatives of victims of the Duterte administration's campaign against illegal drugs requested the help of the National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) in looking into the surge in online harassment and disinformation about the victims as well as the "war on drugs".

4. In the aftermath of the kidnapping and slaying of a businessman and his driver, the National Capital Region Police Office (NCRPO) has intensified security in Filipino-Chinese communities and other areas in Metro Manila that has a considerable presence of foreigners. The NCRPO's efforts includes round-the-clock patrols as well as the deployment of overt and covert policemen. Earlier, Movement for the Restoration of Peace and Order (MRPO) Founding Chairperson Teresita Ang See called on the PNP to recall policemen who have been assigned election-related duties to deploy them to fight crimes in light of the increasing incidence of crimes such as kidnapping. For its part, the Volunteers Against Crime and Corruption (VACC) warned that the rise in the number of kidnap-for-ransom cases in the country might also hurt the Philippine economy due to capital flight and decline in investor confidence.
5. Pope Francis passed away on 21 April 2025 at the age of 88. According to the Vatican, the cause of the latter's death is a stroke. Pope Francis, who was elected to his post on 13 March 2013, was largely seen as a progressive leader within the Catholic Church. In the Philippines, the President declared a period of national mourning from 23 to 26 April 2025 over the Pope's death.
6. As a result of the tariffs imposed by United States (IUS) President Donald Trump on imports from Southeast Asian countries ranging from 10% to 49%, the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) met on 10 April 2025 to explore a coordinated regional response to the US tariffs. Among the measures to be explored are the promotion of intra-ASEAN trade to reduce the region's reliance on the US market and to support member-states with vulnerable economies.
7. On 04 April 2025, the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical, and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) officially lifted the La Niña alert in the country. At the same time, the agency continued to issue warnings about dangerous heat levels, with the heat index reaching as high as 42C to 45C in certain parts of the country.

Pulse Asia Research's April 2025 *Pulso ng Bayan* Pre-election Survey:  
Media Release on the May 2025 Senatorial Election  
05 May 2025

**Registered voters are supporting an average of eight (8) candidates running for the Senate while only a little over a quarter of the electorate (27%) have a complete senatorial slate; out of 64 senatorial bets, 14 have a statistical chance of winning, with Senator Christopher Go enjoying solo 1<sup>st</sup> place (62.2%)**

With around three (3) weeks to go before the May 2025 elections, Filipino registered voters (i.e., those likely to vote and those ambivalent on the matter of casting their ballot) are expressing support for a mean of eight (8) and a median of 8 of their preferred candidates for the Senate. Across geographic and socio-economic subgroupings, mean figures range from seven (7) to nine (9) while median figures vary from six (6) to 10. (Please refer to Table 1.)

Only 27% of registered voters have a complete slate for the Senate (i.e., they are expressing support for 12 senatorial candidates). Essentially the same figures are recorded in each area and class (20% to 35% and 27% to 29%, respectively).

Among the 64 individuals running for senator in May 2025, 14 have a statistical chance of making it to the winners' circle if the elections took place during the survey period. Most of the probable winners are either former or incumbent legislators and are running under the administration's *Alyansa Para sa Bagong Pilipinas*. In solo 1<sup>st</sup> place is Senator Christopher Go, one of the candidates of the *Partido Demokratiko Pilipino-Lakas ng Bayan* (PDP-Laban), whose reelection bid is supported by 62.2% of registered voters.<sup>1</sup> (Please refer to Table 2.)

Sharing 2<sup>nd</sup> to 4<sup>th</sup> places are ACT-CIS Party-List Representative Erwin Tulfo (42.4%), former Senate President Vicente Sotto III (41.1%), and Senator Ronald dela Rosa (41.0%). Senator Ramon Revilla Jr. finds himself in 5<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup> places (35.6%) while former Senator Panfilo Lacson makes it to 5<sup>th</sup> to 9<sup>th</sup> places (33.8%). They are followed by two (2) other candidates with a best statistical ranking of 5<sup>th</sup> place, namely, Mr. Ben Tulfo (33.5%, 5<sup>th</sup> to 10<sup>th</sup> places) and Senator Manuel Lapid (32.2%, 5<sup>th</sup> to 11<sup>th</sup> places). Completing the top half of the list of probable winners is Makati City Mayor Mar-len Abigail Binay (30.2%, 6<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> places).

Meanwhile, the following candidates are in the bottom half of the list of those with a statistical chance of winning a senatorial seat:

1. Senator Pia Cayetano (29.9%, 7<sup>th</sup> to 13<sup>th</sup> places);
2. Mr. Willie Revillame (28.6%, 8<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> places);
3. Las Piñas City Representative Camille Villar (28.3%, 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> places);
4. former Senator Emmanuel Pacquiao (28.3%, 9<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> places); and
5. former Senator Paolo Benigno Aquino IV (25.4%, 11<sup>th</sup> to 18<sup>th</sup> places).

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<sup>1</sup> For this survey, Pulse Asia Research asked respondents to fill up a sample ballot similar to the ballot to be used on election day. Among those surveyed, 8.0% voted for candidates who have already withdrawn from the elections, 7.2% refused to fill up the ballot given to them, and 1.8% accepted the ballot but left it blank.

**Preference for a party-list group is expressed by 83% of registered voters; 34 groups would have a statistical chance of winning at least one (1) seat in the House of Representatives if the May 2025 polls were conducted during the survey period**

Among the 155 groups participating in the May 2025 party-list election, five (5) have a chance of winning three (3) seats, which is the maximum number of seats a group can win under the party-list system. These probable winners are Duterte Youth (5.57%), Agimat (5.52%), ACT-CIS (5.17%), 4Ps (4.85%), and Senior Citizens (4.55%). *(Please refer to Table 3.)*

Seven (7) groups have a chance to win 2 seats each. These are Tingog (3.63%), Uswang Ilonggo (2.48%), PPP (2.38%), Nanay (2.28%), Ako Bicol (2.20%), Asenso Pinoy (2.19%), and AKO Bisaya (2.08%). The other probable winners with 1 congressional seat each are: (1) 4K (1.95%); (2) 1-Rider Party-List (1.89%); (3) COOP-NATCCO (1.88%); (4) Malasakit@Bayanihan (1.74%); (5) FPJ Panday Bayanihan (1.67%); (6) Bicol Saro (1.67%); (7) AGAP (1.64%); (8) United Senior Citizens (1.51%); (9) GP (Galing sa Puso) (1.43%); (10) One COOP (1.35%); (11) Solid North Party (1.25%); (12) Kalinga (1.21%); (13) Trabaho (1.15%); (14) Abang Lingkod (1.11%); (15) Damayang Filipino (1.04%); (16) Magsasaka (1.02%); (17) Swerte (0.99%); (18) TUPAD (0.98%); (19) CIBAC (0.98%); (20) Batang Quiapo (0.97%); (21) TODA Aksyon (0.97%); (22) TGP (0.92%); (23) OFW (0.87%); (24) Ang Probinsiyano (0.82%); (25) ALONA (0.81%); (26) Ahon Mahirap (0.80%); (27) BHW (0.80%); (28) CWS (0.77%); (29) ACT Teachers (0.74%); (20) ANGAT (0.73%); (31) Kabataan (0.65%); (32) Apat-Dapat (0.65%); (33) Abamin (0.64%); and (34) Babae Ako (0.62%).
